10 marks are assigned for the ideas. If the student writes irrelevant ideas (such as the description of a particular friend rather than the general characteristics of a good friend), most of the marks assigned for this part will be lost.

20 marks are assigned for mistakes in spelling, grammar, punctuation and capitalization.
