 - (3 m) Addressee: himself/audience
 - (5 m) Occasion: First Soliloquy after King's and Queen's trials to convince him to cast off sadness.
 - (5 m) Theme: hamlet is sad because of his mother's hasty marriage.
 - (5 m) Importance to characterization: Hamlet is a gloomy person who has lost all his mirth. He is depressed affected deeply by his father's death and by his mother's over-hasty marriage.
 - (5 m) Language: verse full of imagery, apostrophe, metaphors, comparisons.
 - b- (2 m) Speaker: Claudius
 - (3 m) Addressee: God
 - (5 m) Occasion: a pray after the play within a play
 - (5 m) Theme: repentance for his murder
 - (10 m) Plot: Hamlet is sure now that his uncle is the murderer of his father and is determined to kill him to take revenge. However, he does not stab him because he was praying in the hands of God. He does not want to send him to heaven. So this pray postpones Claudius' death
